



A Japan & Syria Art Mile Project

This project of JAM's is supported by Kansai University, JICA (Japan International Cooperation Agency) and UNRWA (the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees)

This would be a typical model of Cross-cultural Learning through ICT and ART. Japanese students and Palestinian students from Syria learned about the other culture using ICT such as internet video conferences and email exchanges via BBS on the website, and then created one mural in collaboration as a fruit of learning.



"The Palestinian and Japanese Festival"

The Palestinian students drew the Japanese World on one half of the canvas then Japanese students drew the Palestinian World on the other half, both based on what they had learned from the other. This is a very process of understanding and respect for diverse cultures! This is a real United World!

[Theme of the mural]

"FESTIVAL of SYRIA & JAPAN" - A blending of two cultures

In the square, Japanese and Palestinian people in respective national costumes play music and dance together to celebrate the blended nations festival friendly hand in hand.

Around the square, there are food stand shops and art craft market, which show peculiar culture rooted among the peoples.

Facing the square, each traditional town spreads over its side, and beyond the town, nature of its own feature lies over.

And a white pigeon is flying over the two towns just as a proof of friendship of the Japanese and Palestinian students and also as a symbol of Peaceful Bright Future for the two nations...hoping for leading to World Peace!
